Throughout the day vocalist Abbey Mordue contributed a powerful lead in a style closely resembling that of her two great idols: Ella Fitzgerald and Billie Holiday. EXPLORING COMET 67P: THE EUROPEAN SPACE AGENCY'S ROSETTA PROJECT.

Talk by Stephen Lowry

The European Space Agency's Rosetta spacecraft has been studying comet 67P/Churyumov-Gerasimenko up close for over a year. The images sent back from the OSIRIS optical camera instrument on board the orbiter have revealed a striking and bizarre world. Dr Lowry will summarize the latest findings from the mission with emphasis on the imaging data from OSIRIS, and will also discuss what we still hope to learn as the probe continues to escort the comet around the Sun.

Thursday 28th July 2016



This is an all day visit to Highclere Castle, nr. Newbury, Berkshire, home to the Carnarvon Family. In 1838 the 3rd Earl transformed his home into a grand mansion which would impress the world. During the first world war the Castle was transformed into a hospital by Almina, the 5th Countess of Carnarvon and it was in 1922 that the 5th Earl and Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun which at that time was a worldwide global event! More recently Downton Abbey has been filmed here. The State Rooms are of great interest and for art lovers in the State Dining Room is Van Dyck's great equestrian portrait of Charles I.

Macbeth

25th ~ 28th MAY 2016

2016 marks the 400th Anniversary of the death of our greatest playwright, William Shakespeare, which Kentish Opera is marking

with a new production of an opera based on one of his plays.

Verdi was a fervent admirer of Shakespeare composing three operas based on his plays. He described Shakespeare's *Macbeth* as 'one of the greatest creations of man'. He took great source material and used it to compose an opera with choruses that range from eerie (the witches) to heart-wrenching (the people of Scotland).

The Macbeth couple are two of the most thrilling leading roles in all of opera. Macbeth and Lady Macbeth burn with ruthless passion but their reign is finally engulfed by their doomed fate.

Macbeth is an opera teeming with madness, the supernatural, and savagely unrestrained passion, which combined with the brilliance of Verdi's richly emotional score, makes it an opera not to be missed!

This new production is traditionally staged and sung in English with professional soloists and orchestra together with the superb Kentish Opera chorus. The cast and orchestra are conducted by Robyn Sevastos and directed by Terry John Bates, who has worked with English National Opera and Metropolitan Opera. The stunning sets and costumes are created by Enid Strutt and Carol Stevenson, with spectacular lighting by Colin Martin.
