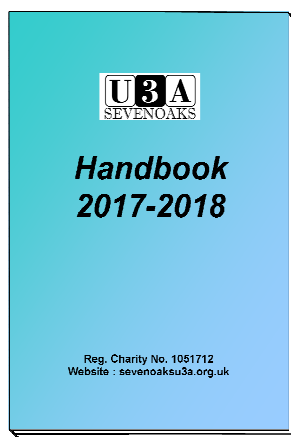
## HANDBOOK FOR 2017-2018

## Folk Dance Group

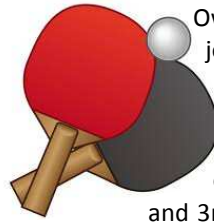

**Report on the visit to Crossness Pumping Station by Tony Martin**



I have been interested in beam engines ever since my first visit to Cornwall many years ago and have wanted to visit Crossness Pumping Station for some time.

I thought the whole experience most enjoyable. We had a big and friendly group.

The volunteer team of engineers were all most welcoming, informative and helpful. I thought it was great

that they involved the ladies in start-up.

The beam engine's design and operation was a revelation in that it incorporated just about every feature of what was then cutting edge technology, but to my delight still maintained the old terminology.

The building and its sister building over the river at Abbey Mills were constructed in 1865 and 1868 respectively for the newly formed Metropolitan Board works of London.

Both buildings were designed by the MBW architects, the one at Abbey Mills apparently being more imposing.

There are four engines which were originally built in the James Watt Soho

factory in Birmingham, subsequently being replaced on two occasions by the existing, unique versions.

**World Health Organisation: promises, promises, promises. Talk by Dr Win Gutteridge**

The WHO was formed at the end of World War II to address global health issues, especially as they related to infectious diseases. In the mid-1970s, it promised 'Health for all by the year 2000'. In the year 2000, it signed up to the health components of the United Nations' 'Millennium Development Goals'. In 2016, the WHO moved on from these to embrace the UNs' 'Sustainable Development Goals' for 2016-2030. In this talk, Win will assess how well the Organization has delivered on the first two of these sets of promises and, with the imminent arrival of a new Director General, how well might it do over the next 15 years.

### Science Study Day 14<sup>th</sup> June 2017 – Book Now!

Preparations are well in hand for our Science Study Day which addresses **Climate Change: Facts, Causes and Consequences**. As part of the preparation your organising committee have held a four way Video Conference with our speakers, who are all experts in their respective fields, to ensure we have an informative and useful day. The topics will include the measurement of climate change, by Professor Sir Brian Hoskins, Global evidence by John Halladay, and the socioeconomic impact over the next decade by Dr Swenja Surminski. Reference to insurance and UK flood risk will be addressed.

A summary will be presented on the recent Paris Agreement and the likely UK legislation which will follow.
