## SCIENCE STUDY DAY ON CLIMATE CHANGE

On 14 June, Sevenoaks U3A Science Group held its annual Study Day at the Orchard Conference Centre, East Malling, on the theme of Climate Change: Facts, Causes and Consequences.

The enthusiastic attendees, just short of 100 in number, came not only from Sevenoaks, but across Kent from Dartford to Rye.

The programme opened with Sir Brian Hoskins (Grantham Institute, Imperial College) setting the scene with a comprehensive understanding of the latest scientific assessment of the changes in the earth's climate. This was followed by John Halladay (Greenpeace) illustrating the impact of changes of climate on people and the environment; a presentation enhanced by his collection of graphic slides and personal experiences. Dr Swenja Surminski (Grantham Institute, London School of Economics) covered the social and economic impact on the UK, drawing on her own research into the economic consequences of flooding.

Finally, a presentation by Sir Brian summarised previous attempts to reach international agreement on reducing the level of "greenhouse gases" generated by human activity and its impact on climate change, together with his assessment of the importance of the December 2015 Paris Agreement.

The presentations were followed by a lively question and answer session involving the audience and the three presenters including a small number of dissenting voices from climate change sceptics.



### U3A SCIENCE NETWORK ANNUAL MEETING

7-10 August 2017

This may not be the most catchy of titles, but this summer school was great fun. It was held at the Jubilee Campus of Nottingham University and attended by 75 U3A members from all over the UK. The accommodation was good, the food was good, but most importantly the lectures (15 of them) were very good. They ranged from the New Physics to the Statistics of Florence Nightingale; from Climate Warming to the Evolution of Bats and every one was interesting, even those I had not expected to be.

The star event was a visit to the British Geological Survey where we saw exquisite fossils and learned about the Institute's work; played with models; watched a film about the surface of Great Britain and the strata beneath, wearing 3-D glasses, and found ourselves gobsmacked by huge sheds of core samples from around the country. The paths in the beautiful grounds were paved with stones in chronological order and here and there stood large boulders of gneiss, basalt, granite, limestone, etc. The institute is worth a visit on its own.

I really would encourage other members of Sevenoaks U3A to attend one of U3A's excellent and inexpensive summer schools next summer.

### KENT PAINTERS' GROUP EXHIBITION & SALE


