
CHAIRMAN'S COLUMN

We are lucky to have found a new Group Development Coordinator, Sue Christy, who is a long-standing Su3a member with experience of a number of other Su3a management roles. In addition to the roles set out above she intends to bring in ideas and innovation from outside, help the exchange of information between different groups, be involved in updating the handbook, and organise the open afternoon.

It would be great to have some team members who have been in our u3a for only a few months or years, along with longer-term members. Members with differing interests, and those who may not have volunteered before, would also be very welcome. At this stage the roles and remit are only loosely defined so there is an opportunity to structure the team to make best use of everyone's talents. SCIENCE OPEN MEETING

Venue: Otford Village Memorial Hall entry £2.00 Our Talk will be 'The History of Computing' by **Sheridan Williams**

The National Museum of Computing, located in Bletchley Park, is an independent charity housing the world's largest collection of functional historic computers and WW2 machines, including Enigma, Lorenz, the working Turing-Welchman Bombe, the rebuilt Colossus, the world's first electronic computer, and the WITCH, the world's oldest working digital computer.

Our speaker Sheridan Williams is a retired rocket scientist, who used early valve-based digital computers and analogue computers and later ran his own computer company and now is a volunteer at the National Museum of Computing at Bletchley. Sheridan will present the history and development of the computers we use today.

Our March Talk will the 'Hydrogen Economy' by Steve Brown. This was postponed from December 2022 due to bad weather.
