



Chairman's note

This month has seen a lot of U3A activity both within Sevenoaks and in the surrounding U3As. As a result of the Open Afternoon a number of new groups have been formed and are beginning to get established. We also attracted new members, so a welcome to them, and I hope in time they will play their part in the success story of our U3A.

On the wider front I attended an SE Regional Meeting on 26 October at Tonbridge School and met people from other U3As and our regional representatives. The message from them is that we are growing, with a national membership of around 250,000 members. By contrast, the turnover for National Office is around £1m or about £4 per head, so it is clear to see the success is not about money: it's about the members and the ethos of self-help.

With a number of local Chairmen I went along to the launch of a new U3A in Paddock Wood (Report on p2.) It was an excellent example of a community pulling together, and we wish them every success.

In our own U3A, the Chairs of the Computer and Science sub-Committees become vacant at the next AGM - under our constitution these posts must change every four years. The jobs are not daunting or bureaucratic; they can be fun. Nevertheless, they are important in helping to make the U3A run smoothly. So if you feel you can contribute, or know someone who can, please speak to one of the Committee to find more about the jobs.

Christmas is not too far away! Please look out for a whole range of events in the local area. Much of what has been alerted to us is advertised either by our Newsletter or Flyers or on our website.

News and Views

Articles to Magda Sweetland Earlier this month, the speaker at the Science group meeting was Andrew Mayfield, from the Kent Community Archaeology Project. Here he explains the purpose of the work:

Have you ever wanted to try your hand at archaeology? You can! **Shorne Woods Country Park**, near Gravesend, has a wealth of history and archaeology within its boundaries, all of it being investigated by interested volunteers. The Project has been running for the past five years. We have been investigating the archaeology of the Park and have found sites dating from the Mesolithic period (over 8,000 years ago), a medieval manor site and the remains of RAF and Army camps in the woods.

The park has had a Community Archaeologist since 2006 as part of a Heritage Lottery-funded project which aims to identify, investigate and conserve the many different sites within the park. Anyone with a passion for the past can get involved in various ways. Field walking, surveying, researching historic documents, artefact identification and excavation are just some of the activities on offer. The archaeology spans many periods: from Stone Age flint tools scattered on the high heath, to the remains of the 20th century clay working industry, which created much of the park's contours today. A World War II RAF billet camp still lies hidden in the trees, and a grand medieval manor house with numerous outbuildings once stood looking down a slope towards the Thames.

Excavation takes place at the site of this manor house each July. Everyone is welcome to join in, whatever their level of experience. Volunteers can come for as many, or as few, days as they wish and all equipment is provided. If you are interested in taking part, please contact the Community Archaeologist at <u>heritageconservation@kent.gov.uk</u>

We have also been studying the remains of the clay works of the former Cobham clay pit, owned and operated by APCM, later Blue Circle. As part of these investigations we are keen to talk to anyone who may have worked at the clay works, or may have photos of the workings. We are also very keen to talk to anyone who may have served at RAF Gravesend and been based at the camps or being housed in the camps after the war. Your memories could contribute to the bigger picture that is currently being built of the area by a team of enthusiastic heritage volunteers. The need for more U3As:

On 26 October there was a **Seminar** in Tonbridge run by National Office with four speakers who have different roles in the South East Region. Some striking points were made by Barbara Lewis (retiring Vice-Chairman of the Trust) who stressed the need for new U3As to meet the ever-growing demand. She belongs to South Herts U3A but, when they reached what they felt was their capacity, they helped to launch the third U3A in nearby Watford. Salisbury, too, has had three U3As for about twelve years now, each working independently to keep its own character, but offering spare places in their Study Groups. This is the best of both worlds: a U3A which is a sensible size as an administrative unit, but still has the benefits of a wide choice in subjects. It can be done! Incidentally, National Office is now recommending that there should be a U3A every five miles!

Paddock Wood Launch was held on 3 November and was attended by 120+ potential members. Fourteen people offered to join a committee, and a similar number said they would lead a Study Group. All the Chairmen of adjacent U3As attended and spoke about different aspects of the U3A.

Helping adjacent U3As: Several U3As in Kent have asked to see a copy of the 2011 Knole and Sevenoaks Handbooks and the Newsletters. *Time to Learn in Sevenoaks* has been much admired and it happens to coincide with an exercise run by National Office on giving Group Contacts/ Leaders the kind of information they want. The Chairman of the national Education team has asked to quote from the booklet, which is good news.
