
## Military History 2

# HOLIDAY IN PROVENCE OCTOBER 2013

# A 6-day Holiday in Provence for U3A Sevenoaks Members and their Spouse, Partner or Friend

This is a 6-day (5 nights) holiday to beautiful Provence travelling by Eurostar to Lille and then by TGV to Aix-en-Provence. The itinerary includes a full day to explore Aix-en-Provence, the capital of Provence and birthplace of Cezanne with its fountains, its outstanding architecture and museums and its daily, flower, food and antique markets. This will be followed by coach visits to Avignon, famous for its ramparts and the Pont Saint-Bénezet and with an option to visit the Palais des Papes where Popes resided from 1309 to 1364; Sainte Marie de la Mer ("St. Mary of the Sea"), capital of the Camargue, famous for its wild horses and bird-life; historic Arles including a visit to the world famous Roman Amphitheatre built in 90 AD; and a full-day tour of the Luberon Mountains.

- DATES: Sunday, 6<sup>th</sup> October to Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> October 2013
- TRAVEL: to Aix-en-Provence by Eurostar and TGV via Lille.
- HOTEL: 3\* EScale Oceania, Aix-en-Provence, half board.
- COST: £763.00 per person sharing based on a minimum of 35 persons travelling. Single supplement: £190.00. Six single rooms available. The cost includes return train journeys from London, coach travel in Provence, five nights half-board accommodation as above and entrance fees to Pont Saint-Bénezet at Avignon and the Roman Amphitheatre at Arles.
- EXTRAS: Travel insurance, coach to Ebbsfleet and return, lunch each day, entrance fees to Palais des Papes, Avignon (optional, about €10.50 payable locally), wine and gratuities.
