

Chairman's note

As we enter another New Year, may I take this opportunity to wish all of you a happy and fulfilling 2013. The Festive Lunch on 4 January was again a successful event enjoyed by all there. My thanks to the Social Events Committee for arranging this.

At our recent New Members' coffee morning we welcomed over twenty new members: I hope they quickly find groups and activities to suit their needs. Our success as a U3A means that there is a continued demand for membership: we are classed as a large U3A and this provides a dynamic organisation but it does need coordinated teamwork to keep everything running efficiently

Our neighbour, Knole U3A, has grown rapidly over three years until its Trustees and members voted at their 2012 AGM to limit their intake. Sevenoaks U3A has continued to replace retiring members, and the total now stands at 903. However, there will be a continuing demand for U3A places in the Sevenoaks area which Knole is addressing to help develop capacity in West Kent - see overleaf. We will work closely with Knole as plans develop.

We need to review our own plans for the future and I will be writing to you to outline our position and tell you what we are planning. I shall ask the Group Organisers to assist in this process, and to act as a conduit for collecting members' views from within their groups. Group Organiser Coffee Mornings this year will be used to further the discussion, so I encourage all Group Organisers to attend and participate: dates will be announced shortly. Members can, of course, feed any views directly to any of us on the Executive Committee as well.

In the picture ...

In the October Newsletter we issued an invitation to the Photography and Camera Groups to tell us something about themselves and their activities. Here are the first two (illustrated, of course) contributions we have received:

Photography

If you look in the current Handbook you will see that there are nine photography groups. The group that I run is simply called **Photography** and I started it in the dark (pre-digital) ages of 2002.



Not long after I joined the U3A it was proposed to hold an Art Exhibition. I asked if this would include photography and found myself on the organising committee. At that Exhibition there were just two of us exhibiting photographs. Soon after that it was suggested that I might like to start a Photography Group. I agreed to do so but didn't expect anyone to be interested. I was wrong! Three signed up, and I am pleased to say that they are all still active members of the Group. The next year eight more were added to the list.

We concentrate on trying to take better pictures, leaving the technical stuff to others! Our aim is to learn to use our eyes to spot a subject before we even involve our cameras, though one of the rules is to have your camera to hand – it's not much use in your pocket or rucksack, or worse still left at home!



We meet in different locations with our cameras, and discuss the results later; we visit Exhibitions; and we have a challenge each year. In 2008 we produced a Calendar, a copy of which was given to each U3A member. Each month's photograph was taken by a different member of the group.

We were also involved with an Arts project at Ightham Mote, helping six- and seven-year old children learn how to 'Think, Point & Shoot' – their results were wonderful. Another year we photographed the same view four times to illustrate the Four Seasons.

This year we have quite a challenge – we have been asked to collect images for use on the new Website, to illustrate each Group activity. For various reasons the photographs should not show people who can be identified, while images from the Internet cannot be used for possible copyright reasons. We have divided up the group so that each of us has seven or so subjects to cover and it is proving interesting and difficult – one member told me of her idea for 'Current Affairs' but I think she is on the wrong track!! So look out for the new Website and see how we are managing to record our U3A.

Digital Camera 2

I took over as organiser of the group in September 2012. We have a well-knit group with some good photographers, but felt that we had room for a couple more members. I duly booked a table at the Open Day last September, assisted by John Anthony, one of our group members.

We set out our stall with what we do - a mixture of group discussions, talks on photography techniques and visits to places of interest to take photographs and then compare the results later. Some of our members brought along A4 prints of their work, which provoked quite a lot of interest, with some people just stopping to chat and others interested in joining the group.

Some other members of our group visited our table and I suggested that we might produce a Calendar for 2013 to showcase our work. John mentioned a magazine advertisement he'd seen for printing calendars and offered to organise it. Group members were asked to submit their favourite pictures for inclusion and thirteen people responded: we had a picture for each month of the year plus one for the front cover.

We had already decided not to have a "theme" as such, and as a result we have a diverse range of pictures, including Spring and Summer landscapes, Autumn and Winter scenes, a meerkat and a vintage Alpha Romeo! Pictured below is the front cover, with Jeff Lee's seasonal picture of Otford Pond.

A last minute 60% reduction in price by the Publisher was the icing on the cake and, thanks to John, who collated and submitted the images, we have a Calendar of our work which we can enjoy for the rest of the year.


- Thursday 21 March
