#### Publications

Are you thinking of joining one of the Sevenoaks U3A Committees? In each of the next few issues we aim to describe the work of a Committee, starting this month with our own, the Publications and Distribution Committee.

This is a very hands-on group, chaired by Magda Sweetland. It functions at three levels - annual, monthly and occasional.

The annual Handbook is the magnum opus of Magda, Robin Tonge and John Gandon. Magda produces the admin pages; Robin prepares the material provided by Group Organisers and for publication; and John turns it all into the booklet we know so well, ready for printing.

Ten times a year we produce the *Newsletter*. Linda Young collects together all the regular material; Magda adds articles and other information to produce a first rough draft; John Spurway adjusts the material as necessary to conform to the house style and to fit the available space comfortably. Email means the draft now flashes round the team for proof-reading especially by Robin, who can spot a missing space at twenty paces - and subsequent correction. Robin also prepares the flyers for U3A events in co-operation with the organisers. The Newsletter is not just a noticeboard for people to stick things on: the editorial team seeks to offer a clear, consistent, informative and readable document, and we hope you find it so.

Two days before a Monthly Meeting the envelope stuffing team, led by Mary and Colin Butson, assembles to bring together all the material available for distribution. That is how your envelope is ready for you on Wednesday at the Meeting or, if you are not there, drops through your letter-box a couple of days later.

The 'occasional' part of the job is to give individual editing and proof-reading help to people wanting to publish a booklet about their activities.

There is an urgent need for new blood on the editorial team. Most of us, to use an over-worked but suitable cliché, are past our sell-by date, and very ready to pass on the baton - hopefully at the next AGM. It is clear that there will be a move towards distribution by email, though only where members want this. While we trust that editorial standards will be maintained, it is likely that there will be effects on the production process. We would like to think that Sevenoaks U3A has members with experience of publishing in a modern context, or for whom electronic office facilities have been the normal experience, who are ready to take over from us. If it is you, and you would like to know more, please give one of us a ring - NOW!

# **Forthcoming Science Events**

The Science Committee has planned a series of events this year as follows:

On **20 May, The National Physical Laboratory** (NPL) has its biennial Open House. Did you know that 20 May is World Metrology Day? It marks the anniversary of the signing of the Metre Convention in 1875, which continues to provide the basis for a single, coherent system of measurements, traceable to the International System of Units (SI). NPL is also the home of the new generation of Ion Clock capable of maintaining accuracy of one second in the life of the Universe! There is much more to see at the NPL. We have arranged for lunch in the NPL restaurant from 1.0pm. The suggested method of travel is by train from Sevenoaks to Waterloo and then on to Teddington. #### 11 June - Science Study Day at the East Malling Research Centre (EMRC)

This Study Day has been organised to look at the challenge of future food production. The pressure of increasing global population means that food production over the next 50 years needs to double that produced in the previous 150 years. The EMRC, with other institutes, is working towards this goal. Our keynote speaker will be The Earl Selborne, GBE. FRS who champions agricultural matters in the House of Lords. # 16 July – CERN and the Large Hadron

**Collider**, the largest scientific experiment ever constructed. It is buried deep under the Swiss/French border, and is where we can learn about fundamental research on the biggest mysteries of our Universe, and see inside the world's largest particle physics laboratory.

The morning tour starts at 9.00am. There is a restaurant on site. There are also two free, permanent exhibitions which can be visited in the afternoon: the Universe of Particles, and Microcosm.

We have booked 48 places and will organise a package through a local travel agent for those who only wish to stay two nights.


