Immediately after the AGM we have a very interesting talk on Wildlife Photography and this will be followed by our usual tea & cakes.



Wine Groups

From my point of view, having started 3 groups, the groups tend to stick together having learned to gradually build their vocabulary of taste which is sometimes impossible to impart in words, but agreed in discussions and developed in tastings .

The format that we have developed over 10 years of imbibing seems to engender an amicable sharing of knowledge beyond the simple sampling and invariably drinking wines from many countries. The discussions and presentations frequently involve historical facts, terroir, conditions and practices and partnering wines with various food. We seem to have taken it a little more seriously as time has elapsed. We try and have a small selection of cheese, biscuits, and pâté, whatever suits the selection of wine.

It takes some time to get a group established. I am reluctant to be the group organiser for another group but would be happy to set a group on the road. My commitment to two groups already is sufficient and I am embedded too deep in them to withdraw, as the camaraderie is great in both groups. We all share the cost fairly by setting a small sum to cover at least the wine.

So if you are interested, please register your interest and as soon as there is a sufficient number another group can be started so everyone starts from the same baseline.
