Cambridge

FOR LOVERS OF ART AND GARDENS TUESDAY, 7 MAY 2019

On Tuesday May 7 there will be a coach trip to Cambridge to visit Kettle's Yard where a private tour of the house in small groups has been organised. You will also have the opportunity to visit the new art gallery attached to the house. In the early afternoon you will be taken by coach to the Cambridge University Botanic Garden which has a huge collection of plant species from all over the world and is a lovely place for a leisurely stroll.

Between 1958 and 1973 Kettle's Yard was the home of Jim and Helen Ede. In the 1920s and 30s Jim had

been a curator at the Tate Gallery in London. Thanks to his friendships with artists and other like-minded people, over the years he gathered a remarkable collection of 20th-century art, both paintings and sculpture.

At Kettle's Yard Jim carefully positioned these artworks alongside furniture, glass, ceramics and natural objects, with the aim of creating a harmonic whole - not "an art gallery or museum". In 1966, the Edes gave the house and its contents to the University of Cambridge. In 1970 the house was extended and last year a new gallery for changing exhibitions was added.

Cambridge University Botanic Gardens has a collection of over 8,000 plant species from all over the world and it is a beautiful place for all to enjoy.
