



SECURITY OF PROTECTED E-MAIL ADDRESSES ON OUR WEBSITE AND SCAM ALERTS

Approximately two years ago the webteam advised Group Organisers that we were changing the way in which we protected all individual contact details on the website. This move was done in anticipation of the 2018 Data Protection Legislation and to protect private emails from phishing and other unwanted electronic approaches.

The Webteam have over recent months received a number of enquiries from GO s about annoying messages via their website protected addresses stating 'Message undeliverable'. The message is sent from a server identified as 'kundenserve.ge' followed by a lot of unintelligible computer code, but within it will be one or two real addresses stating 'Reply to:etc'

These messages are in fact being stopped by our Website host firewall and are protecting your personal email from being visible (phished) by the outside world. The web host server is therefore doing its job of stopping spurious messages. Unfortunately the downside is that the host server notifies all recipients of the action it has undertaken.

With the help of our Web host 1&1 lonos, we have beefed up our security by imposing SSL Certificates which are small data files that digitally bind a cryptographic key to an organization's details and we continually block as many messages from external sources as we can.

However, the scammers are very resourceful and will continually seek out ways of trying to steal your personal information. Despite our efforts you may still get scam messages that bypass the Web site server.

The rules are simple:

- Use and maintain a strong Anti-Virus and Malware programme
- Be vigilant, do not click on any link or attachment from addresses you do not recognise
- Undertake good housekeeping maintain regular backups of all your data, ideally on a device separate from you main computer and undertake regular disc cleaning operations especially if you use the Internet on a regular basis. Many sites allow 'Cookies' to be placed on your machine and they will slow things down - delete them.
- Use strong passwords to protect sensitive data

The webteam are continuing to explore security features and we are exploring options that allow two-way communication. This will be assessed on the basis of its functionality and cost.
